EXPECTATIONS FOR PARENTS:

SUPERVISION: Parent/Guardians are advised and are required/expected to maintain supervision of their minor children throughout the event. Parents/Guardians are expected to remain in activity rooms with their minor child, and are not to drop off their child in those rooms or any other spaces.

EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM (Optional): Parents/Guardians are advised that they may download the Rave Guardian App, if they wish to receive emergency campus notifications while the minor is present on the College campus: https://www.ithaca.edu/ic-alert/rave-quardian-app

CONDUCT: If the Program Director (listed below) determines that a minor must be removed from the Program due to any safety-related or other behavioral misconduct, parents/guardians must remove the minor immediately.

ROLES OF PROGRAM PERSONNEL:

IC Program Staff:

Program Director: Ed Catto, ecatto@ithaca.edu

- Supervises IC students who are assisting as IC Event Coordinators
- Every safety/security/injury/abuse incident must be reported to Program Director

IC Event Coordinators: Select currently enrolled Ithaca College students

- Responsible for monitoring areas with minor participants in attendance
- Responsible for reporting abuse involving any minor participant to the Program Director
- May be identified by event badges/nametags

Non-Ithaca College Program Organizers

Volunteers from "Comic Book Club of Ithaca"

- Provide operational assistance only
- Do not share monitoring responsibilities for protection of minors
- May be identified by color-coded badges/nametags

IC Non-Program Personnel Roles:

Public Safety Office: On call at (607) 274-3333

Instructions from Office of Public Safety MUST be obeyed at all times.

SUPERVISION OF MINORS

- Parents/Guardians are solely responsible for supervision of minors in attendance
- Program Director and IC Event Coordinators are 'authorized adults', authorized to facilitate programs involving minors
- Each authorized adult is responsible at all times for reporting suspected abuse or neglect involving any minor participant, to the Program Director and to the Office of Public Safety
- Programming standard is that a minor participant will be reasonably protected from any unreasonable risk to their health or safety, including abuse or public health hazard
- If parent/guardian leaves a minor unattended, any disciplinary concerns must be referred to Program Director, who is solely authorized to issue a disciplinary restriction or removal
- At no time will any Program personnel (Program Director or any other employee, student, or representative) ever touch or physically restrain a participating minor for disciplinary purposes.
